THE COURT: Apparently all I have is this posttermination review?

MR. SLATINA: Keast, your Honor.

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: Last but not least.

MR. SLATINA: I'd like to next call the matter of the Keast minors, case number 05-005315, today is the time and date set for a post-termination review hearing. Curt Slatina appearing on behalf of the Prosecuting Attorney's Office, present with me is Lacey Gonzalez-Borstler from Newaygo County DHS. I'd ask the court to mark and admit the report, accept the recommendations in the report.

MS. FRISBIE: Christine Frisbie on behalf of the minor children, no objection to the report being marked and admitted and the recommendations being ordered.

THE COURT: We've got Alyssa and Amber.

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: Yes.

THE COURT: Five year old and--

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: --Amber's a four year old in a week.

THE COURT: Yeah, where are they now?

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: They are in foster care with the same foster mother throughout this whole ordeal. She does not feel it's in their best interest for her to be the adoptive

parent. She believes that those children need a two-parent family. I wish she would reconsider, but that's not going to happen. She's done wonderful with those two.

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: They've had a lot of behavioral issues. Alyssa has anxiety disorder, post-traumatic stress; they've been through so much and in so little time for their age. We--I've made a--they are on medication and that seems to be helping. There are some attachment issues there, if the foster mom leaves for a few days for a training, she's a mental health professional herself, so, you know, they'll have some behavior issues if she's out of the picture.

THE COURT: So, they're not easy children to find a home for?

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: Pardon me?

THE COURT: They're not easy children to find a home for?

MS. GONZALEZ-BORSTLER: Well, I don't think so, but at the same time we have referred the case to adoption. Bethany was assigned, Bethany Christian Services was assigned, there is a worker, Suzanne Adams. Unfortunately at this point we've had—well; we've had two interested parties, both relatives, submit intents that they would be interested in adopting. However, one relative is on the Central Registry and the other relative are the grandparents, and the children were actually when they were

removed, were living at grandma and grandpa's and grandfather was smoking marijuana; there were allegations, unsubstantiated allegations of physical abuse. This is a case where, if you remember, Mrs. Erica Keast, the children's mother has reported smoking marijuana with her father since she was 15 years old. It's also the case where the grandfather was going to the school without permission and trying to see the children, and taking photographs at one point in a neighbor's parking lot, while Alyssa was at recess. So, I'm not thrilled about the prospect of adoption with a family member, I'm actually against it. Bethany is going to be doing their home studies and assessments and we'll see what happens. She has told me that on the chance that the relatives were denied that she has a home in mind that's non-relative, that would be an appropriate place for the children.

THE COURT: Well, it appears that reasonable efforts are being made, although progress is slow relative to the adoption of these children. The record can also reflect we got a letter from the mother here in July, addressed to the court, that even though she recognized she had terminated her rights to the children she didn't want them to continue in foster care. Let's see, back in March I signed off on my children, is there any way I can petition the court to give my children to someone I know? I don't want my children in foster care anymore. I want to know that they are safe and being cared for. I'm being held in cell

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B-7, thank you for your time, and hope to hear from you soon.

MS. FRISBIE: Your Honor, I just saw her in court too, she was charged with a felony.

MR. SLATINA: I think she just pled to something, actually I think it's a larceny.

MS. FRISBIE: She said--and I saw her in the hallway, and I said, what are you doing here? She said, I'm still having trouble.

THE COURT: That's too bad.

MS. FRISBIE: Yeah.

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THE COURT: I guess I made the appropriate finding.

MR. SLATINA: Thank you, your Honor.

THE COURT: That's all for today, thanks.
